 receive invitations. They should give the URL to any students who are joining remotely but they
 are responsible for admitting students to the videocon.
- For all videoconferences, please mute unless you need to speak. We start with the moderators commenting on the global results. If anyone connecting has a question during this presentation, they should use the "hand-raising" feature in Zoom or indicate that they have a question in chat. (We will monitor this.) After the moderator discussion of results, we will ask for questions from each school in turn, so students should ask their questions then, whether remote or in class. Students should go close to the microphone to speak. Anyone may put a question or comment in chat at any time in the videocon.
- Please remember that we have resources to help you and your students to understand World Wide Data Day. Most are on the <u>W2D2 Homepage</u>. Scroll down and look under Resources.
